WELCOME ADDRESS

Dear colleagues

It is our great pleasure to cordially invite you to the city of Heraklion, Greece from June 16th to 18th, 2025, where the event "Real life challenges in the continuity of care in older adults" will take place. This will be a joint event of the PROGRAMMING COST Action 21122 (PROmoting GeRiAtric Medicine in countries where it is still eMergING) and the Sprin-G of the Global European Initiative (GEI) group of the European Geriatric Medicine Society (EuGMS).

PROGRAMMING is an EU funded COST Action (2022-2026) focusing on the education and training of the existing workforce across European countries on basic principles of Geriatric Medicine, as a first pragmatic approach to the challenge of the complex healthcare needs of our globally ageing populations. Similarly to PROGRAMMING, the GEI group of the EuGMS also aims to advocate for Geriatric Medicine across Europe and promote standards of quality care for older people. Organized by the GEI in different countries with emerging Geriatrics since 2022, the Sprin-G meetings are annual events based on a novel concept of impactful scientific activities, with an emphasis both on the lifelong approach to ageing trajectories, the continuity of positive healthcare transformation of local societies and the combination of the scientific, social and cultural aspects of a health-related topic.

By co-organizing this event at a local level, the Internal Medicine Department-Clinic of Geriatrics of the Heraklion University Hospital, the Department of Social Work of the Hellenic Mediterranean University, the Hellenic Society for the Study and Research of Ageing (HSSRA) and the Region of Crete along with the Regional Development Fund of Crete, advocate for the need to upgrade the care for older people -especially in countries where Geriatric Medicine is not well established yet- at the local scientific community and the local society.

Recognizing that in our aging societies healthcare practitioners encounter a number of obstacles and practical difficulties in their efforts to provide consistent, continuing, and integrated care to older individuals, this event focuses on implementation and aims to provide insights for best practices, motivating healthcare professionals, engaging stakeholders, and inspiring policymakers. It aspires to provide a global approach including a rich scientific program by prominent international and national contributors. The program includes workshops on the ICOPE (Integrated Care for Older People) approach by the World Health Organization and an ageing-simulation experience by the HSSRA, round table discussions involving local stakeholders and international experts and aiming to raise awareness and engagement for the added value of the Geriatric Medicine approach, as well as keynote lectures highlighting the local cultural aspects of the amazing blue zone area that hosts us.

With the hope this event will be a landmark for the promotion of Geriatric Medicine in countries where it is still emerging, we welcome you to Heraklion, in June 2025.
